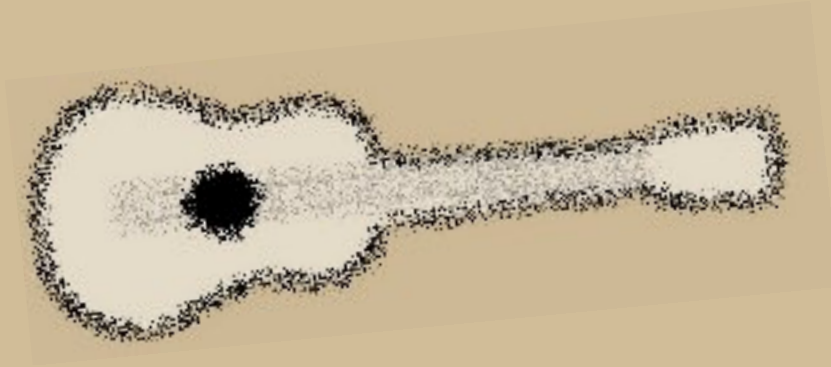

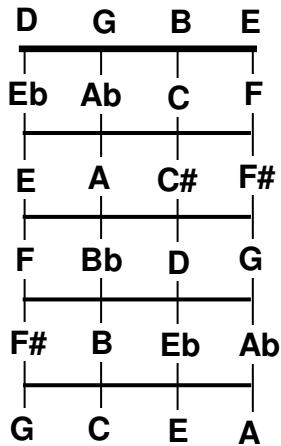

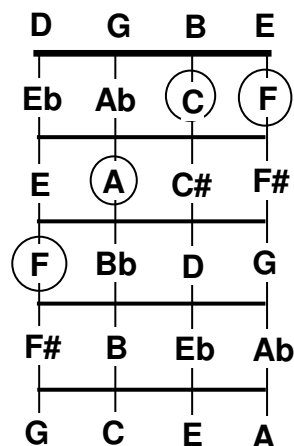


Where are the notes on the ukulele

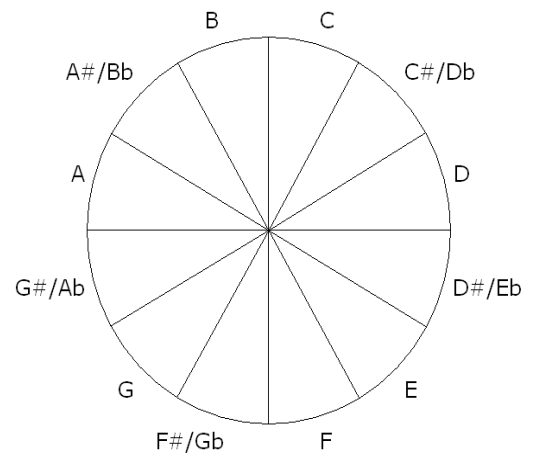
Here is the notes on the ukulele



Here is how a F chord is played



This is how the notes interact



What does the chord abbreviations mean (here shown with C as an example)

C, Cmaj or C major	C major is the most common chord (C, E, G)
Cm	C minor, here is the E lowered to a Eb (C, Eb, G)
C° or Cdim	C diminished means that it is reduced and the E and G are lowered to Eb and F# (C, Eb, F#)
C ^Δ or Cmaj7	C Major 7 means a C major with the 11halfsteps tone added (C, E, G, B) in this case a C major and a E minor chord combined
C+ ,Caug or CmMaj7	C augmented means intesified and here is the G highered to a Ab (C, E, Ab)
Csus	C suspended is a chord that is a mix of previous and upcoming chords, most common is Csus4 and includes (C, F G)
Cm7	C minor 7 is an ordinary minor chord with the 7th tone added (C, Eb, G, Bb)
C7	C7 is an ordinary major chord with the 7th tone added (C, E, G, Bb)
